A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, blindness and severe visual impairment affects approximately 200,000 residents of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, persons with visual impairments want to live independent and productive lives in our communities; and

WHEREAS, the majority of these persons use a travel aide, such as a white cane or dog guide; and

WHEREAS, these travel aides are universally recognized as symbols representing loss of vision; and

WHEREAS, people who operate motor vehicles must be alert for visually impaired pedestrians


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jim Doyle, Governor of the State of Wisconsin do hereby proclaim October 15, 2007

WHITE CANE SAFETY DAY

in the State of Wisconsin, and urge operators of motor vehicles to be acutely aware of visually impaired pedestrians and obey the Wisconsin laws that protect them.
