

What is Assistive Technology (AT)?

Any product or piece of equipment used to maintain or improve the functional capabilities of people with disabilities is an Assistive Technology Device.

Examples include: wheelchairs, vehicle modifications, hearing and vision products, computers and software, service dogs, and more.

Any service that helps a person select, use, or purchase an assistive technology device is an Assistive Technology Service.
