<p>Family Type for Work Participation</p>	<p>This code indicates the type of family for purposes of calculating the work participation rates. Valid values are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 - Family included only in the overall work participation rate 2 - Two-parent family included in both the overall and two-parent work participation rates 3 - Family with no Work Eligible Individuals and excluded from both the overall and two-parent work participation rates
<p>Family Affiliation Code</p>	<p>This indicates the relationship of the adult individual to the family receiving assistance. Valid values are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 - Member of the family receiving assistance 2 - Not eligible, parent of minor child in the family receiving assistance 3 - Not eligible, caretaker relative of minor child in the family receiving assistance 4 - Not eligible, minor sibling of child in the family receiving assistance 5 - Not eligible, person whose income or resources are considered in determining eligibility for or amount of assistance for the eligible family receiving assistance
<p>Parent with Minor Child</p>	<p>This indicates whether the individual is the parent of a minor child in the family and whether this status is used in the two-parent participation rate calculations. Valid values are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 - Yes, and used in the two-parent participation rate calculations 2 - Yes, but not used in the two-parent participation rate calculations 3 - No, not a parent of a minor child

<p>Work Eligible Individual</p>	<p>This indicates how an individual is considered for work participation rate calculations for federal reporting. The valid values are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 - Yes, an adult receiving assistance 2 - Yes, a non-recipient parent due to a sanction 3 - Yes, a non-recipient parent due to a time limit 4 - Yes, a non-recipient parent receiving SSI (and State opts to include) 5 - Yes, a non-recipient parent due to other reasons 6 - No, a non-recipient, but not a parent 7 - No, an ineligible alien due to immigration status 8 - No, a non-recipient parent receiving SSI (and State opts to exclude) 9 - No, parent caring for a disabled family member in the home
<p>Work Participation Status Code</p>	<p>This code indicates the work participation status of the individual. The codes that are not used (03, 04, 05, 06, 08, 10, 11 and 13) are not listed below.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 01 = Disregarded; Single parent with child under 12 months 02 = Disregarded; Required to participate, but not participating; sanctioned for the reporting month, but not sanctioned for more than 3 months within the preceding 12-month period 07 = Exempt, disabled 09 = Exempt, under a federally recognized good cause domestic violence waiver 12 = Required to participate, but not participating in any core or non-core activities; sanctioned for the reporting month; and sanctioned for more than 3 months within the preceding 12-month period 14 = Required to participate, but not participating in any core or non-core activities; and not subject to sanction for the reporting month

<p>Work Participation Status Code (Continued)</p>	<p>15 = Deemed engaged in work -- single teen head-of-household or married teen who maintains satisfactory school attendance</p> <p>16 = Deemed engaged in work -- single teen head-of-household or married teen who participates in education directly related to employment for an average of at least 20 hours per week during the reporting month</p> <p>17 = Deemed engaged in work -- single parent with child under age 6 and parent engaged in work activities for at least 20 core hours per week</p> <p>18 = Required to participate and participating in at least one hour of core or non-core activity, but not meeting minimum participation requirements of at least 30 total hours of which 20 hours must be core</p> <p>19 = Meeting minimum participation requirements of at least 30 total hours of which 20 hours must be core.</p> <p>99 = Not Work Eligible</p>
<p>Education Directly Related to Employment Hours</p>	<p>This is the number of average weekly scheduled hours the individual participated in education directly related to employment activities for the report month. This number is derived from multiple occurrences of multiple components that make up this Federal Category. (BE, LS, EL when individual does not have a High School diploma or equivalent)</p>
<p>Job Skills Training Hours</p>	<p>This is the number of average weekly scheduled hours the individual spent in job skill related training activities for the report month. This number is derived from multiple occurrences of multiple components that make up this Federal Category. (BE, LS, EL when individual has a High School diploma or equivalent)</p>

Job Search Hours	This is the number of weekly Job Search hours that are reported to the federal government and used towards the work participation rate. Job Search hours are only reported if they are needed to meet the participation rate, otherwise they are saved for the future.
Satisfactory School Attendance Hours	This is the average weekly scheduled hours spent by the individual in attending school for the report month. This number is derived from multiple occurrences of multiple components (GE, HE, RS) that make up this Federal Category.
Unsubsidized Employment Hours	This is the number of average weekly scheduled hours the individual spent in unsubsidized employment for the report month. This number is derived from multiple occurrences of multiple components (WF, WP) that make up this Federal Category.
Vocational Educational Training Hours	This is the number of weekly Vocational Educational Training hours that are reported to the federal government and used towards the work participation rate. Vocational Educational Training hours are only reported if they are needed to meet the participation rate, otherwise they are saved for the future. (TC, JS, VA, VE, VL)
Work Experience	This is the number of average weekly scheduled hours the individual spent on work experience activities for the report month. This number is derived from multiple occurrences of the component (WE) that makes up this Federal Category.
All Family Removal Reasons	<p>This indicates the reason why the case was removed from the all family participation rate. The case might be removed from the all family rate for one of the following two reasons.</p> <p>01 - Single parent family with child less than 1 year old</p> <p>02 - The case is sanctioned for report month</p>

All Family Removal Reasons (Continued)	and the case is not sanctioned for more than 3 months in last 12 months
Two-parent Family Removal Rate Reasons	<p>This indicates the reason why the case was removed from two-parent participation rate. The case might be removed from the two-parent rate for one of the following reasons if any of the work eligible individuals in the family has that work participation status code.</p> <p>02 - The case is sanctioned for report month and the case is not sanctioned for more than 3 months in last 12 months'</p> <p>07 - One of the parents is disabled'</p>
