CWAG to Hold Family Care Consumer Corp Training in Onalaska

(Madison, WI) – Applications are currently being accepted to attend the Coalition of Wisconsin Aging Groups’ Family Care Consumer Corps Training on February 27 at the Stoney Creek Inn, which is located at 3060 S. Kinney Coulee Rd. (Off I-90 and Hwy 16), Onalaska, Wisconsin.

The Coalition of Wisconsin Aging Groups (CWAG), under a grant from the Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services will provide this free training from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. The training will focus on options for long-term care for older people and people with disabilities through the implementation of the Family Care Program within the West Central Wisconsin Area (Buffalo, Trempealeau, Jackson, Monroe, LaCrosse and Vernon Counties). Lunch and training materials will also be provided at no cost. If you need special accommodations, please call 800-366-2990 ext. 326.

Family Care is a comprehensive and flexible long-term care service system, which strives to foster people's independence and quality of life, while recognizing the need for interdependence and support. Currently being piloted in five Wisconsin counties, Governor Doyle has made a commitment for Family Care to be implemented statewide in five years.

CWAG’s Family Care Consumer Corp Training will educate attendees on issues involved in implementing Wisconsin’s Family Care long-term care delivery system and help mobilize them to provide input into the implementation process. In addition to raising awareness of critical issues, this training session will work toward the creation of an on-going means of educating and motivating older people and people with disabilities to provide consumer input into the new Family Care system.

“Overwhelmingly, older people have told us that health and long-term care issues top the list of their concerns,” said Tom Frazier, CWAG Executive Director. “As a result, CWAG has strongly supported this expansion and we feel it is critical that older people and people with disabilities be educated and able to participate in the process of structuring Family Care locally.”

A second day of training will be scheduled at a later date. The training can only accommodate a limited number of people.
