Resource Centers are operated by counties, and are not associated with any businesses or service providers so you can be sure you receive the information you need to make the best choice for you.

Professional staff are available to meet with you in your own home, at the Resource Center, or at another location that is convenient for you and your family.

Free Services

There is no charge for pre-admission consultation or any other Resource Center service.

Apply for Financial Assistance

People who need help paying for long-term care services and support can apply for funding at the Resource Center.

It is Never Too Early to Learn about Medicaid

It is important to know about eligibility requirements for government funded long-term care programs if you are considering a move into a nursing home or assisted living facility. As you consider your options, ask:

- How long will my personal funds last?
- Are there ways I can make my money last longer?
- What will happen if (or when) I run out of money?
- What financial help is available and how do I become eligible?
- Will I be able to stay in the facility I am considering if my payment source changes?

- Important things to consider when choosing among long-term care programs and benefits.
