Wisconsin's Medicaid Programs and FoodShare Return to Routine Operations March 8, 2023



Introductions

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"Unwinding" Defined

The process states will undertake to return to routine operations in Medicaid programs, as temporary policies related to the pandemic start to end.



Status of Unwinding

- The federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 (CAA)
 - Ended FoodShare emergency allotments as of February 2023
 - Separated continuous coverage from the federal Public Health Emergency (PHE)
 - Set a timeline for states to begin renewals for all members

 New Medicaid applicants as of April 1, 2023, will be subject to normal program rules



BadgerCare Plus and Medicaid members must remain eligible unless they pass away, move out of state, or ask to leave the program

- Federal law applies to:
 - Existing members as of March 20, 2020
 - Anyone who became a member between March 20, 2020, and March 31, 2023

Unwinding Process

- Unwinding will be a first-of-itskind process for Medicaid programs across the country.
- DMS has been preparing for unwinding for over a year in close collaboration with partners.

 Our vision for this process is a successful return to routine operations while supporting our members, your constituents, and partners.



FoodShare Update

- February 2023 was the last month for FoodShare emergency allotments (EA)
- Members received mail, email, and notices, and we posted on social media

Food Support Resources

FoodShare is Wisconsin's version of the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Programs like FoodShare used to be called food stamps. People who apply and have low income can get benefits to spend at participating grocery stores, farmer's markets and other places that sell food. Continuous Coverage

Members with continuous coverage:

- Members enrolled on or before March 31, 2023.
- Coverage will continue until they complete their renewal.

Anyone who enrolls starting April 1, 2023, will be subject to normal program rules.



Renewal Information

- Renewals have been distributed evenly over 12 months.
- The first renewal due date will be June 30, 2023, and the last will be May 31, 2024.
- This week DHS began to send letters telling members their renewal due date.
- Each member will get a renewal packet 45 days before their due date with next steps.
- Members should renew after they received the 45 day renewal packet.
 Members should not renew before they receive the packet.

Member Communications

- Encourage constituents to provide their current address.
- Ask them to watch their mail for a letter from us in March/early April which includes their renewal due date.
- Ask them to watch for a renewal packet 45 days before their due date and read it.
- Encourage them to act only after they have received their 45-day renewal packet.
- Health care coverage continues until their renewal due date.

Watch. Read. Act.

Watch your mailbox. Read letters from us. Act by the deadline.

BadgerCare Plus and Medicaid renewals are back!



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It's renewal time!

You must complete a renew process each year to keep your benefits. Here's what to do:

- 1. Read the enclosed letter to find out your next steps.
- 2. Note the due date and respond on time.
- 3. Don't wait follow the instructions right away.

Income Maintenance (IM) Agency Capacity

- IM agencies will have an increased workload during unwinding and are expected to process about 60,000 renewals a month statewide.
- This workload of renewals in addition to their regular work supporting new applicants and helping members manage their benefits.

Other Changes

- The Public Health Emergency ends on May 11, 2023.
- DHS is working with our federal partners to comply with changes needed as a result of the ending of the Public Health Emergency.



How You Can Help

- Direct constituents to make sure they have an account at access.wisconsin.gov.
- Emphasize to members the importance of knowing their renewal date.
- Encourage constituents not to renew until they get their renewal packet in the mail or in their ACCESS account. It will come about 45 days before their renewal due date.

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Questions: Constituents

> To get information about what's happening with their coverage, constituents should:

- ✓ Watch their mail and ACCESS accounts for letters.
- Read those letters for information about what they should do.
- ✓ Act after their 45-day renewal packet arrives and by due dates in the letters.
