**FoodShare Work Requirement Time Limit Suspension for High Unemployment Areas
for Federal Fiscal Year 2025**

EFFECTIVE DATE

October 1, 2024

PURPOSE

This operations memo announces updates to the suspension of the FoodShare work requirement time limit for able-bodied adults without dependents (ABAWDs) who live in geographic areas experiencing unemployment at higher rates than the national average.

BACKGROUND

Federal law requires FoodShare members who are ABAWDs to meet a work requirement to maintain FoodShare eligibility. FoodShare members who must meet the FoodShare work requirement can only receive FoodShare benefits for three months in the three-year FoodShare clock period if they are not meeting the FoodShare work requirement. This policy is called the FoodShare Work Requirement for ABAWDs. Federal regulations allow states, with approval from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), to suspend the time limit of the FoodShare work requirement for FoodShare members who live in areas where the unemployment rate is higher than the national average.

POLICY

Effective October 1, 2024, through September 30, 2025, FoodShare members who live in the following geographic areas will have the FoodShare work requirement time limit suspended due to unemployment rates higher than the national average:

CITIES

- City of Racine

COUNTIES

- Adams, Bayfield, Douglas, Florence, Forest, Iron, Marquette, and Menominee counties.

TRIBAL RESERVATION AREAS

- Members who live on tribal lands and reservations belonging to: Bad River Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians, Forest County Potawatomi Community, Ho-Chunk Nation, Lac Courte Oreilles Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians, Lac Du Flambeau Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians, Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin, Red Cliff Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians, St. Croix Chippewa Indians of Wisconsin, Sokaogon Chippewa Community Mole Lake Band, and Stockbridge-Munsee Community Band of Mohican Indians.

Members who live on tribal lands and reservations belonging to Oneida Nation and Fond du Lac Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians will also have the time limit of the FoodShare work requirement suspended.

Members living in any of the above geographic areas who are ABAWDs will not lose FoodShare eligibility if they do not meet the FoodShare work requirement during this period.

All FoodShare applicants and members aged 18 to 54, including those living in a qualifying geographic area, must continue to be screened for qualifying exemptions from the FoodShare work requirement at application and renewal.

The city of Milwaukee no longer qualifies for a waiver as of October 1, 2024. Members determined to be ABAWDs who live in the city of Milwaukee must meet the work requirement.
