

Injury Prevention Toolkit

This document provides an overview of injury prevention (IP) resources and educational opportunities. The intent of this document is to provide guidance for injury prevention and trauma staff. The resources and educational opportunities listed will be updated periodically.

The purpose of Wisconsin's statewide trauma care system is to reduce death and disability resulting from traumatic injury by providing optimal care of trauma patients and their families and collecting and analyzing trauma-related data (<u>Wis. Admin. Code § DHS 118.01</u>). Injury prevention activities are a key component to a successful trauma program and system.

Training Resources

Free Web-Based Courses

<u>Safe State Injury and Violence Prevention (IVP) Tools</u>: Safe States provides toolkits and interactive web-based resources aimed at advancing the field and supporting the injury and violence prevention (IVP) workforce to develop and assess program and evaluation activities. While all of Safe States' tools are free to the public, members are engaged in the development, evaluation, and showcasing of tools.

The IVP 360 self-study combines the basics and essentials of IVP while also focusing on key concepts, foundational elements, and tools and resources available to assist in collaborative program planning and evaluation. This self-study features recordings of members and other IVP professionals and resources on a wide range of topics relevant for professionals at all levels. You may participate in this self-study from start to finish or pick and choose the topics most important and interesting to you.

Free Ongoing Education

<u>Children's Safety Network (CSN):</u> CSN works with states and jurisdictional maternal and child health and injury and violence prevention programs and provides webinars along with infographic materials to use.

<u>Injury Prevention Research Center (IPRC) Webinar Series</u>: These webinars take place on the second Wednesday of each month from 12 p.m.–12:30 p.m. Eastern time. Each month features a new speaker presenting on a different IVP topic.

<u>Midwest Injury Prevention Alliance (MIPA) Virtual Conference</u>: MIPA is an organization of injury professionals from states in Federal Health and Human Services Region V (Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota, Michigan, Ohio, and Wisconsin) that works collaboratively to reduce unintentional and intentional injury-related death and disability.

<u>University of Michigan Injury Prevention Center</u>: Injury prevention online course lays a broad foundation for pediatric injury prevention to give learners an in-depth awareness of this major public health issue through powerful, concise, up-to-date lectures, interviews, and demonstrations from a multidisciplinary panel of nationally recognized injury prevention experts. CHES credits are available.

<u>National Child Passenger Safety (CPS) Board</u>: The National Child Passenger Safety Board offers webinars, education and resources including putting CPS in emergency vehicles, the <u>Child Passenger Safety Learning Portal</u>, and others.

Northwell Health: Northwell Health provides ongoing free webinars on gun violence education.

Regional Trauma Advisory Council (RTAC): An RTAC is a group of health care organizations, first responder agencies, and public safety and public health partners collaborating to develop, implement, monitor, and improve their regional trauma system. They provide regional meeting opportunities, trauma education, and more.

Free and Fee-Based Ongoing Education

<u>American Trauma Society (ATS)</u>: Learn from hospital-based injury and violence prevention professionals about the latest injury and violence prevention programs and research.

<u>Futures Without Violence:</u> Educational programs, strategies, and tools to advance the movement toward futures without violence/intimate partner violence.

<u>Safe States Annual Conference</u>: The Safe States Alliance is a national non-profit 501(c)(3) organization and professional association whose mission is to strengthen the practice of injury and violence prevention. It includes committees, work groups, special interest groups, online training, and conference. Membership is required for some website activities, and some are free. The conference has a fee for in-person attendance.

Fee-Based Ongoing Education

<u>Governor's Conference on Highway Safety</u>: The Governor's Conference provides attendees with exceptional opportunities to learn more about current evidence-based best practices in education, enforcement, and partnerships. Child passenger safety is the featured topic. There is a registration fee for in-person attendance.

<u>Lifesavers Conference</u>: The Lifesavers Conference provides a national platform with over 70 workshops in 10 tracks, plenary sessions, and an extensive exhibit hall. The Lifesavers Conference program is designed to engage federal, state, and local government, law enforcement, public health, injury prevention, advocacy and non-profit organization professionals in an exchange of ideas, strategies and programs to reduce preventable injuries and deaths. There is a registration fee for in-person attendance.

<u>Safe Kids Worldwide Childhood Injury Prevention Convention (PrevCon)</u>: PrevCon is one of the largest gatherings of safety professionals in the world dedicated solely to the field of childhood injury prevention. There is a registration fee for in-person attendance.

<u>Society for Advancement of Violence and Injury Research (SAVIR)</u>: The Society for Advancement of Violence and Injury Research (SAVIR) is a professional organization that provides leadership and fosters excellence in the science of preventing and treating injury and violence. There is a registration fee for their annual conference.

<u>Trauma Center Association of America (TCAA) Conference</u>: TCAA's Annual Trauma Conference offers hospital and trauma system administrative professionals a one stop educational conference. In addition to the 2-day annual meeting, pre- and post-conference courses are also offered, and cover trauma operations, including: system development, finance, reimbursement, advocacy, performance improvement, and many facets of

leadership development. The goal of TCAA's conference is to prepare participants to address the issues confronting trauma centers and trauma systems, now and in the future. TCAA also offers online education and webinars. Membership for website education is required and there is a registration fee for in-person conference attendance.

Fee-Based Online Courses

<u>Child & Adolescent Injury Prevention Course</u>: From the University of Michigan, this online course lays a broad foundation for pediatric injury prevention to give learners an in-depth awareness of this major public health issue. The course also provides a toolkit of strategies with detailed examples of injury prevention concepts. Dates, cost, and registration information is on the website.

<u>Comprehensive Education for the Injury Prevention Professional</u>: The ATS puts on this is a 2-day online course that covers injury and data analysis, education, program development, advocacy, and injury prevention promotion. Dates, cost, and registration information is on the website.

Media 101, Media 201 and Social Media Training: Nationwide Children's, The Center for Injury Research and Policy at Nationwide Children's Hospital hosts online workshops for public health professionals. Date, cost, and registration information is on the website.

<u>Principles and Practice of Injury Prevention</u>: Johns Hopkins University hosts 4-day online course during summer. Date, cost, and registration information is on the website.
