

Mental Health / SUD Reports

View and print summary reports for Mental Health / SUD functional screens. Reports provide information by eligibility, time reporting, and other summary information. The reports provide different options for filtering and sorting functional screen data.



CLTS FS and Quality Improvement

- Minimize time with not functionally eligible (NFE) reviews
- Provide guidelines for internal county waiver agency (CWA) review
- Reduce time and effort to complete screen
- _____
- Increase screener training/outreach
- Added collaboration with stakeholders
- Semi-annual review of the CLTS FS and clinical instructions

CLTS Functional Screen Leads Defined

- Quality improvement to CLTS FS
- Train-the-trainer approach
- Strengthened security to Functional Screen Information Access (FSIA)

CLTS Functional Screen Lead Details

- One or two people in your CWA and one from Comprehensive Community Services (CCS)
- Structure of larger CWAs and subcontracts
- Education and experience
- Communication

CLTS Functional Screen Leads and their Roles

Internal quality

Review CLTS FS before and after calculation for completeness:

- Are all fields marked or explained in the notes?
- Are quality notes written according to format?
- Are you getting a complete picture of this child and their needs?

Internal Quality Screen Time and Notes

- Proper format
- Dates and initials appear with notes in desired format:
 - Newest notes at the top of the note section.
 - Date (MM/DD/YY) Notes Initials.

Internal Quality NFE Process

- Additional contact when FS is NFE
- Was result expected
- Guide referral to other programs

CLTS Functional Screen Leads and their Roles

- Liaison to screener needs and training
 - Added training (UW-Oshkosh, review teleconference recordings)
 - Focused training
 - Training to be developed
- FSIA
 - Review for pending screens
 - Review for current CLTS screeners and access types
 - Add, change, or eliminate screener access

Functional Eligibility Results

- Steps for screeners if CLTS Functional Screen result is NFE:
 - 1. Do not send the screen results to iChange.
 - 2. Self-review screen for accuracy.
 - 3. Have a peer and lead in your agency review.
 - 4. If questions remain, email the <u>CLTS FS</u> mailbox.
- All CLTS and Children's Community Options Program (CCOP) NFE results continue to be reviewed by the Bureau of Children's Services (BCS).

Functional Eligibility Results, cont.

- Steps to take if the result is Functionally Eligible:
 - 1. Send results to iChange.
 - 2. Document results in Program Participation System (PPS) using the appropriate timeline.
 - 3. Discuss results with family for all eligible programs.
 - 4. Begin referral, enrollment, and/or service planning for interested programs based on strengths and needs.

Functional Eligibility Results, cont.

- Coordinating eligibility between programs:
 - ◆ If the screen that was completed changed eligibility results for other programs, work with those programs to alert, verify, and amend.
 - CCOP, CLTS Program, Katie Beckett Medicaid
 - CCS



Screen Time Report

View screen summary information including total screen time by specifying any combination of criteria from screener name, status, agency and screen completion date range. This report also computes total screen time for an agency and for each screener within an agency.

Screener Summary at Agency Level

View and print summary reports for all screeners in different agencies. Reports provide information for each screener in a selected agency with begin date, end date and screener profile. The reports provide different options for filtering and sorting screeners information.


SSN Status Report

View applicant information by specifying any combination of criteria from agency, screener name, and FSIA SSN status. This report is available so that screeners can view applicants who do not have a verified SSN.




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Screen Timelines

- The Screen Completion Date is the date when all sections of the CLTS FS were completed by the certified screener:
 - Not when started into FSIA
 - Not when the screen is calculated
- The 45-day timeline calculates from date of referral to screen completion date.


