Infection Prevention Competencies

Regulatory Requirements: Hospitals

"In designating infection preventionist(s)/infection control professional(s), hospitals should assure that the individuals so designated are qualified through education, training, experience, or certification in infection prevention and control."

CMS QSO-22-20-Hospitals

Regulatory Requirements: Nursing Homes

§483.80(b) Infection preventionist
The facility must designate one or more individual(s) as the infection
preventionist(s) (IP)(s) who are responsible for the facility's IPCP. The IP must:

§483.80(b)(1) Have primary professional training in nursing, medical technology, microbiology, epidemiology, or other related field;

§483.80(b)(2) Be qualified by education, training, experience or certification;

§483.80(b)(3) Work at least part-time at the facility; and

§483.80(b)(4) Have completed specialized training in infection prevention and control.

Who are IPs?


- Come from diverse backgrounds, including nursing, public health, and laboratory






