## Welcome (Katie Sepnieski & John Rathman)

- Report attendance by replying to the email from <a href="mailto:DHSBEOTAdmin@dhs.wisconsin.gov">DHSBEOTAdmin@dhs.wisconsin.gov</a>.
- Bill Hanna, Medicaid Director for the State of Wisconsin, recognized consortia, and staff for the extraordinary lift this past year of unwinding from the public health emergency.
  - May 13, 2024, through May 17, 2024, Economic Support Specialists across Wisconsin are recognized by the Governor' Proclamation. This could not come at a more fitting time as Wisconsin is near the end of the unwinding effort. Throughout this unprecedented time, Wisconsin has remained a leader in SNAP QC and have some of the strongest Quality Control error rates in the nation. Other States are looking to Wisconsin to understand processes and much of the success has to do with the continued relationship with consortia to provide high quality, efficient, and accurate eligibility decisions. The health care renewal process has gone very smoothly, even when there were bumps in the road, consortia worked with the Department staff to create and implement solutions quickly and effectively to not adversely impact members or the experience during the unwind.

- The Department is moving into planning for the next biennial budget and will be seeking input to understand what the new normal will look like for healthcare and FoodShare. The Department appreciates the daily efforts and partnership and look forward to continuing to work with consortia to improve health and well-being outcomes for Wisconsinites.
- Marlia Mattke, Deputy Administrator for the Department of Health Services, recognized consortia
  for the continued effort to improve health and well-being outcomes for Wisconsinites. Just as in
  previous years, encouraged consortia leaders to continue to advocate to legislature about the work
  that they do.

#### Approval of April 18, 2024, Meeting Minutes (Katie Sepnieski)

### **Policy Updates (Department of Health Services)**

#### Healthcare

- Renewals
  - Renewal packets have been sent for June renewals, which is the last renewal cohort with members that still have continuous coverage under the PHE.
- MAPP premiums
  - The Department is preparing to reinstate premiums for the Medicaid Purchase Plan (MAPP) in August.
- Young Adult Letters
  - The Department is exploring options to reduce coverage gaps that occur when children turn 19 and may be eligible for BadgerCare+ as a childless adult but cannot continue to receive benefits on the parents' case.
  - The Department is planning to take these initial steps:
    - Send a one-time letter in July 2024 to any young adult that lost coverage during unwinding and have not been determined eligible for another form of MA. The letter is to ensure youth are aware of the status of the BadgerCare+ coverage and to encourage youth to reapply if needed.
    - Letters will be sent to 18-year-olds and parents in the month turning 19, to notify them that the child needs to apply for MA on their own.
  - The Department is exploring options for texting, emailing, and targeted outreach to the young adult.

- Income Maintenance Operational Analysis (IMOA) subcommittee met on May 3, 2024. John Rathman shared key discussion points (see attachment). Next meeting is June 7, 2024.

- Training subcommittee met on April 22, 2024. Ann Kriegel shared key discussion points (see attachment). Next meeting is July 22, 2024.

### Income Maintenance (IM) Funding and Contract Updates (Alicia Grulke & John Rathman)

- Amended MA Unwinding Fund Contracts for April 1 June 30, 2024, are in the process of being completed based on agencies reported actual funds remaining.
- Written suggestions for the 2025 Income Maintenance contract are to be submitted to John Tuohy and/or the tri-chairs by June 6, 2024.

#### **Consortia Feedback (John Rathman)**

- The consortia request two future agenda items for an Income Maintenance Operational Analysis (IMOA) subcommittee meeting.
  - Confidential Cases Consortia would like an update on CARES and ACCESS changes and a general discussion on consortia needs.
  - Compromising Claims Consortia would like an update on ability to work claims on cases within a consortium but between counties.

## Administrative Memos (Alicia Grulke & John Rathman)

 The Administrator's Memo 24-02, "2024 IM Consortia Administrative Allocation" has been published.

#### Regional Enrollment Network (John Rathman)

- The Fall Conference will occur in September of 2024. Save the dates have been sent. Registration for the conference will start in June.
- A webinar to discuss Unauthorized Marketplace enrollments has been scheduled for Tuesday, May 21, 2024, from 1:00-2:30 p.m. An email with a registration to attend the webinar was sent to the ESPAC membership. The Department and Office of the Commissioner of Insurance will participate in this important webinar.
- Effective November 1, 2024, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) can begin signing up for Marketplace plans that can become effective on December 1, 2024. An Immigration Webinar will be developed in the summer of 2024 to better help navigators and certified application counselors with these changes.
- Work is currently being done to study how Regional Enrollment Networks (REN) will continue to sustain after unwinding work. RENs play a vital role throughout the State in keeping residents enrolled into important health coverages.
