Disability-Owned Businesses

- People with disabilities are 2x as likely to be self-employed
- Estimated 1.8 million disability-owned small businesses

Self-Employed as a Percentage of the Population and Labor Force by Disability Status, Age 18 and over, 2019

	Disability	No Disability
Self-Employed as Percentage of Population	4 percent	8 percent
Self-Employed as Percentage of Labor Force	17 percent	11 percent
Labor Force Participation Rate	26 percent	72 percent



Benefits of Entrepreneurship

- Choice and control
- The use of natural skills and talents
- Expanded work opportunities
- Accumulation of wealth
- Independence and creative freedom

- Negative disability bias

Concerns about Accessing Capital

- Wary of using personal capital
- Bad credit from medical costs
- Benefits related restrictions
- Cumbersome loan processes

Concerns about Losing Public Benefits

- Affect access to benefits
- Friends/Family not supportive
- No access to assistance
- SSA rules not well understood



Insufficient Accommodations

- ASL or captions not available for training
- Limits access to support
- Websites/documents not accessible
- Not plain language
- Entrepreneurial ecosystem not disability aware
