- **Pilot Program: Assistance with Hard to Reach Individuals**
Sometimes residents do not react positively (or at all) to music that we hope would be helpful. Some nursing homes have access to the expertise that music therapists possess, most do not. In order to make available that expertise to homes without a music therapist, Music & Memory is piloting a Music Therapy Support Line. This hotline will make available Board Certified Music Therapists (MT-BC) from the Institute for Music & Neurologic Function's (IMNF's) professional services practice for your most challenging residents. This program will be provided at no cost to you.



Pilot Program: Assistance with Hard to Reach Individuals

How the Music Therapy Support Pilot Program will work:

- Each facility in the pilot will be given an allocation of three support calls. Each call should be for help with a resident who either has been, or is currently, unresponsive to any attempt to listen or respond to music.
- The process is as follows:
 - 1) Facility representative will complete a request form – attached – and return to imnf@centerlight.org
 - 2) An IMNF music therapist will schedule and conduct a phone consult

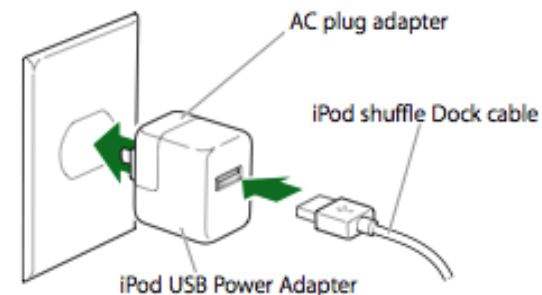
Question regarding Powering iPods

Q: Are facilities permitted to charge iPods in the resident's bedroom directly into a receptacle outlet as depicted in the attached diagram ?

A: Yes, facilities are permitted to charge iPods in the resident's bedroom directly into a receptacle outlet as depicted in the diagram.

- However, please note DHS 132.83 (7) (j) has minimum duplex receptacle requirements for existing or new nursing homes. Basically one duplex receptacle per bed for older homes and two duplex receptacles per bed for newer homes. The facility may need to prioritize resident care equipment due to the limited number of receptacles within certain resident spaces.

- Also, as a general reminder, Music & Memory equipment, as with any equipment put within the resident care and treatment space falls under the general responsibility of facility administration per NFPA 99 section 7-6.2.1.1. Hence – the facility is responsible for the newly introduced equipment, its associated maintenance, and proper use.
