

What is it?



Funded by the Department of Workforce Development and the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation, Think Ability Wisconsin (TAW) is a major statewide initiative and extensive partnership network designed to improve transition and employment outcomes for people with disabilities in our state while simultaneously solving Wisconsin's hiring and retention challenges.

Bridging silos and breaking down barriers for people with disabilities while solving Wisconsin's hiring and retention challenges through a multi-pronged approach.



TAW and why it matters.

- 2M people never returned to the workforce post covid
- If every unemployed person got a job, we would still be 2.5M workers short of the need right now
- 2.4 open positions for every one job seeker in WI
- 600,000 open positions in manufacturing and hospitality in WI alone, increasing 5% on average - significant majority only require HS education
- We are in a hiring and labor shortage crisis, job retention crisis, and we have real wage inflation concerns.
- Only 19% of people with disabilities are employed
- That equates to hundreds of thousands of Wisconsinites who are ready, willing and able to work!
- They just need Wisconsin's employers to believe in them and give them the training and opportunity to succeed.



It's not just the "right" thing to do, it's the smart thing to do.

Research has proven that hiring people with disabilities equals:

- Increased profit margins
- Improved bottom lines
- Higher productivity
- Higher retention rates
- Higher efficiency and quality ratings
- Tax incentives
- Expanded consumer markets
- Reduced turnover rates
- Increased employee motivation and morale
- The ability to meet federal contractor requirements
- Competitive advantages through untapped talent
- Greater diversity



TAW main components.

- A unified statewide collaborative that includes WI's government agencies, employers, educators, advocates, disability and community providers all Thinking Ability and starting with Yes!
- Serving all people with disabilities in WI, their families,
 WI's employers, educators, providers and the public.
- Mass public service campaigns and coalition building designed to raise expectations and change societal behaviors.
- Wide-scale employer outreach, education, training and engagement.
- TAW-Center online to get resources and support in real-time to self-advocates and families, employers, educators, providers, and the general public.



TAW main components.

 Employer-embedded training programs that lead to employment, advanced education, or certification upon completion - esp in manufacturing, hospitality, technology and other accessible industries.

Partnering with the Wisconsin Community Tech College system.

- TAW relationship with DSAW: vision, project lead, fiscal agent, convening agency.

 DSAW also funded to increase its workforce development and wraparound support services.

TAWC: Who We Serve



Self Advocates and Families: Navigating, planning and connecting self advocates and families with resources to create fulfilling and meaningful lives, with a special focus on life transitions and employment. The TAWC website features transition specific training, articles, and resources for youth and families.

Employers: Helping employers hire people with disabilities. The TAWC website and statewide Navigators guide employers to resources, training, and direct support. The TAWC website features employer specific training, articles and resources, as well as job boards to connect employers and their future employees.

Educators: TAWC provides transition specific training, articles, and resources for educators, youth, and families to help students prepare for life after high school. This includes transition, employment, post-secondary education and community-based programs and services.

Service Providers: assisting "those who serve" with the latest and greatest information and best-practices around transition, person-centered planning, competitive integrated employment, how to think possible by thinking ABILITY, and more.


