*A Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) consists of a large population center and the adjacent communities that are economically and socially integrated with that center. An entire county or group of counties constitutes an MSA. Wisconsin had **27** metropolitan counties in **15** distinct MSAs.

A Micropolitan Statistical Area (μ SA) is a geographic region containing at least one urban area with a population between 10,000 and 50,000 and may consist of one or more counties. Wisconsin had **15** micropolitan counties in **14** distinct μ SAs.

All other Wisconsin counties (**30**) are classified as rural.
