

Childhood lead poisoning in Wisconsin is a statewide problem.

Lead-poisoned children have been identified in every county in Wisconsin. The dots on this map represent 45,000 children found to be lead poisoned since 1996.


Lead hurts kids! Lead causes permanent brain damage. Children who are lead poisoned are more likely to:

- Develop learning disabilities, hearing and speech problems, and behavior problems such as aggression and hyperactivity;
- Experience poor school performance including scoring 14% lower on reading and math performance tests in third grade;
- Drop out of high school or become pregnant as teenagers; and
- Commit violent crimes as juveniles and adults.

Teachers, parents and children will find the video and activities fun to do together. Families can easily incorporate the prevention strategies into their everyday routines.


In English and in Spanish

One poster reminds parents to check toys for dust or damaged paint and help young children stay away from peeling paint, wash hands before eating, and leave shoes at the door. The second poster reminds parents to check with the health department to find out when their children should be tested for lead and includes a wallet card to track their lead tests.
