Key Results:

Overall worker safety has improved in Wisconsin between 2009 and 2018.

Workplace injury snapshot:

Workplace injuries decreased 14%

Key improvements:

- Pneumoconiosis hospitalization rate down by 71%
- New cases of carpal tunnel down 65%

Areas to watch:

- Diagnosed workplace related asthma increased 44%
- New cases of mesothelioma decreased 23% but Wisconsin's rate remains well above the national average

The rate of workplace injuries is steadily decreasing.
