<b>Program Name</b>	<b>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Cooperative Agreement</b>
<b>Program Purpose</b>	<p>The purpose of the Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Program is to enhance Wisconsin's ability to rapidly mobilize, surge, and respond to public health emergencies identified by CDC.</p> <p>The PHEP Program is housed within the Division of Public Health, Office of Preparedness and Emergency Health Care. The program is 100% federally funded through a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention cooperative agreement.</p> <p>The Division of Public Health is tasked, under the Wisconsin Emergency Response Plan, to lead efforts related to Emergency Support Function 8 (Health and Medical) and plan and support Emergency Support Function 6 (Mass Care and Human Services) response efforts. To that end, the PHEP program provides technical assistance and guidance as well as communication and logistics to support during disasters and emergencies.</p> <p>The PHEP program works closely with tribal health centers and local public health agencies (LPHAs), healthcare systems, emergency management, communities, and individuals to prevent, protect against, quickly respond to, and recover from emergencies with health consequences.</p> <p>Activities include but are not limited to preparedness for emerging infectious diseases, bioterrorism, severe weather, chemical exposures, nuclear or radiological incidents and enhancing laboratory, epidemiology, and communication capacity. In addition, the program coordinates the Strategic National Stockpile, which supports states with the ability to receive, distribute, and dispense personal protective equipment (PPE), drugs, and vaccines during a health emergency. The PHEP program develops, facilitates, and evaluates local, regional, and statewide exercises to test and improve public health emergency plans.</p> <p>The PHEP program works to make sure that the state of Wisconsin is ready to manage the public health impacts of any emergency affecting our citizens. The objectives of the PHEP Program are to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Provide local public health agencies and tribal health centers with resources to continue to improve their capacities and capabilities to respond to emergencies within their communities and regions through acquiring and managing grant monies; sharing of guidance, tools, and templates; and offering technical assistance.</li> <li>2. Support planning and response activities within the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS), through the coordination of Incident Management System (IMS) training and implementation; development of plans and tools; and facilitation of after action reports and improvement processes.</li> </ol>

3. Work both inter-divisionally and intra-divisionally within DHS to ensure that emergency planning and response efforts leverage all relevant subject matter expertise and incorporate diverse perspectives.
4. Coordinate and cooperate with external partners (for example, Wisconsin Emergency Management, Wisconsin State Laboratory of Hygiene, Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection) in planning for and responding to emergencies in the state of Wisconsin.

In 2011, CDC established 15 capabilities that serve as national standards for public health preparedness planning. Since then, these capability standards have served as a vital framework for state, local, tribal, and territorial preparedness programs as they plan, operationalize, and evaluate their ability to prepare for, respond to, and recover from public health emergencies.

These capabilities were most recently updated by CDC in 2018, and currently comprise the following 15 capabilities, which are organized into six domains:

<b>Program Purpose</b>	In response to the COVID-19 outbreak, Congress appropriated emergency supplemental funding to support the urgent preparedness and response needs of hospitals, health systems, and health care workers on the front lines of this pandemic. As part of this emergency supplemental funding, ASPR provided \$42,000,000 for the Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) cooperative agreement. This funding supports health care coalitions (HCCs), emergency medical services (EMS), state and jurisdiction special pathogen treatment centers, and other health care entities to prepare them to identify, isolate, assess, transport, and treat patients with COVID-19 or persons under investigation (PUIs) for COVID-19, as well as to prepare those entities for future special pathogen disease outbreaks.

DHS 118.09(3) directs all hospitals, ambulance service providers, and first responder services to submit data to the department on a quarterly basis determined by the department.

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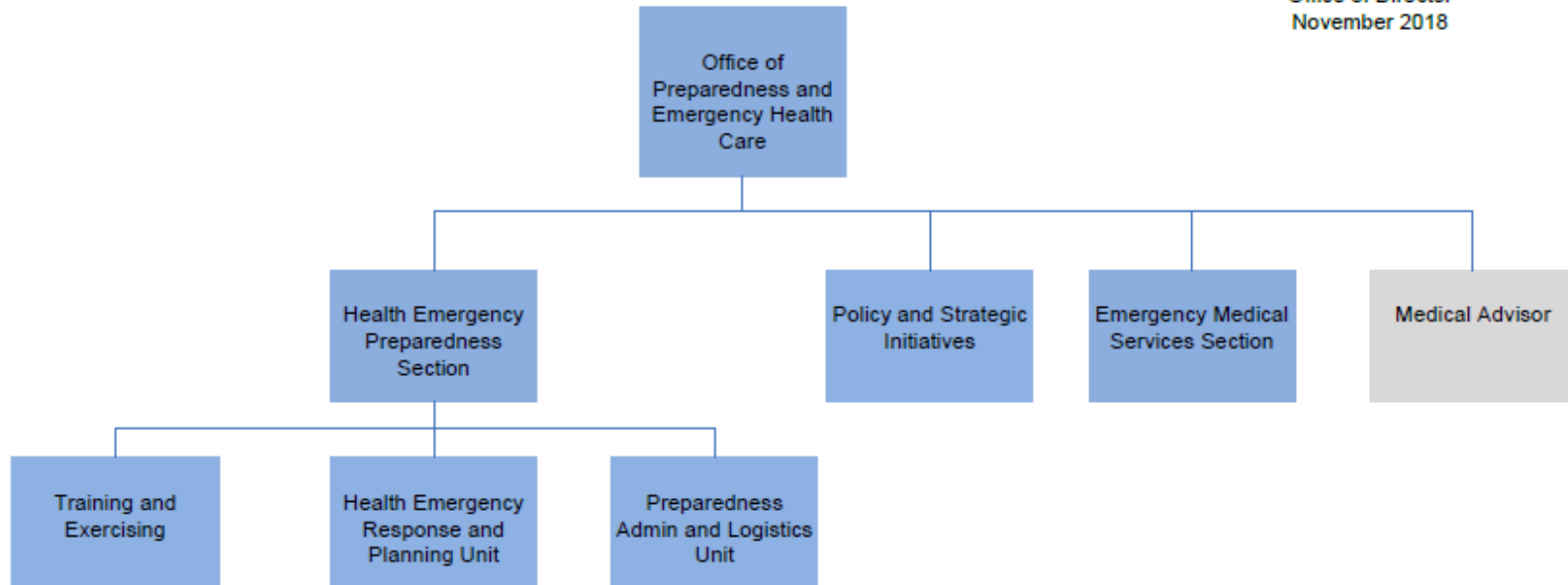
