



Katie Beckett Medicaid Renewals

Katie Beckett Medicaid coverage needs to be renewed each year. Annual renewals require simple paperwork completion. Dedicated eligibility specialists handle all renewals for Katie Beckett Medicaid.

What to Expect at Renewal Time



Renewal letters. You will get renewal information in the mail with instructions approximately 45 days before it is due. ***Your letter will tell you if you need to take action to renew coverage.*** If you do not complete the renewal in time, your child may lose Medicaid coverage.



You may need to update the information we have on file. Each year, Katie Beckett Medicaid must review the information we have on file to see if your child can keep getting benefits. Let us know about any changes to your child's income, living situation, or contact info. Changes can be reported online in your ACCESS account.



Online renewals. You can now renew your child's benefits online. Use Wisconsin's secure website, access.wi.gov. The renewal instructions you get in the mail will detail any actions you need to take. You can also return the materials by mail, fax, or email. Learn more at dhs.wi.gov/kbp/index.htm.



Disability redeterminations. Every child enrolled in Katie Beckett Medicaid needs a disability redetermination every 1-7 years depending on their medical diagnosis. This is called the diary date. Letters are mailed out 90 days before your child's diary date to start this process. An eligibility interview may be necessary. Any forms you need to complete and return and information on how to schedule the eligibility interview (if needed) will be included in the mailing you receive.
