#### **OPPA Overview**

OPPA works to strengthen the public health system in Wisconsin. OPPA has partnerships within state, local, and Tribal governmental public health agencies, across academic institutes, and with community-based organizations and other partners. Together, we promote equitable health outcomes through policy, systems, and environmental change.



#### What does OPPA do?

Through the subject-matter expertise and lived experience of its staff, OPPA:

- Facilitates the State Health Assessment (SHA) and State Health Improvement Plan (SHIP).
- Collects and analyzes population-based data.
- Manages and distributes passthrough **funding** and helps to strategize how to spend **grant** money.
- Reviews and certifies local health departments through the Department of Health Services (**DHS**) **140 program**.
- Assists with system-level public health work areas including community health assessments and improvement plans (CHAs and CHIPs), strategic plans, and workforce development plans.
- ❖ Leads **performance excellence** (quality improvement and performance management) for DPH and provides technical assistance to partners.
- Offers technical assistance, training, communities of practice, and learning communities.
- Provides guidance on statutes and rules.
- Connects partners to and helps them **navigate state agencies** across DHS.
- Convenes and assists with facilitating coalition- and partnership-building.
- Works with partners to integrate health equity.
- Provides support for the Wisconsin Public Health Council.
