



Wisconsin Medicaid and BadgerCare Plus Tuberculosis-Related Only Services

Tuberculosis-Related Only Services is a health care plan for people who have been diagnosed with tuberculosis but do not meet the rules to enroll in Wisconsin Medicaid or BadgerCare Plus. The Tuberculosis-Related Only Services plan helps pay some medical costs for the care of tuberculosis (TB) infection or TB disease.

To enroll in this plan, a person must meet income rules and have been infected with TB. For one person, the monthly gross income limit is \$2,073. For a married couple, the monthly gross income limit is \$3,067.

For a child younger than 19 years old living at home, some of the parents' income may be counted. If someone is married, some of their spouse's income may be counted.

Tuberculosis-Related Only Services only covers services directly related to the care of TB. These include:

- Physician services.
- Prescription drugs.
- Laboratory tests and X-rays.
- Clinic services.
- Targeted case management services.
- Services designed to encourage completion of treatment.
- Services needed due to side effects of prescribed drugs for TB care.

Note: This plan does not pay for hospital stays or room and board.
