# Katie Beckett Medicaid

Katie Beckett Medicaid provides Wisconsin Medicaid coverage to children living at home who have disabilities, chronic illness, or mental health needs to the point of meeting special eligibility requirements. A child can qualify even if:

- Their parents have too much income or assets to qualify for other kinds of Medicaid.
- They have private health insurance.

## Who is eligible?

To get Katie Beckett Medicaid, your child must:

- Be under age 19.
- Meet the definition of "disabled" under the Social Security Act.
- Be a U.S. citizen or qualifying immigrant.
- Be a Wisconsin resident.
- Live at home, in a foster care setting, or in another eligible community-based setting.
- Meet "functional level of care" eligibility.
  This means the child needs the kind of care typically provided by a hospital or longterm care facility.
- Receive safe and appropriate care at home.
- Not have income in their name that is more than the current income limit for those living in an institution.
- Not receive care at home that costs more than the care they would receive in a longterm care facility covered by Medicaid.

# What is the application process?

Parents can apply for Katie Beckett Medicaid for their child, however is easiest for them.

### Who was Katie Beckett?

Katie Beckett was a child with complex health care needs. Her family advocated that the best treatments and services for her were available at home and in a community setting, not in an institution or hospital. The federal government created a special group of Medicaid coverage for kids like Katie Beckett.



# Getting benefits

Katie Beckett Medicaid eligibility specialists answer questions and provide support through the application process. The application process determines if a child is eligible for Katie Beckett Medicaid. To qualify, a child must meet a certain functional level of care. They must also be disabled as defined by the Social Security Administration. Here's how the process works.

**Application** 

An eligibility specialist will meet with you on a video call, or in your home if requested. Together, you'll review the application, verify required documents, and answer questions.

Functional eligibility

The eligibility specialist will use that information to complete your child's functional screen. This standardized tool measures their abilities and day-to-day functions.

Disability determination

You'll help the eligibility specialist get access to your child's medical records. They are reviewed along with the application details to make a disability determination.

Notification

You'll get a letter letting you know if your child is approved for benefits. If so, you'll be mailed a ForwardHealth card. Use it like any other insurance card to get health services and equipment.

#### Renewals

Medicaid eligibility must be renewed every year, or whenever there's a big change in the child's condition. Every child enrolled in Katie Beckett also requires a disability redetermination every one to seven years, depending on their medical diagnosis.
