


The WisTech program provides assistive technology (AT) devices and services throughout Wisconsin to people of all ages who have disabilities.


About Assistive Technology

AT is any device or service that is used by a person to increase or maintain their skills, independence, and safety. AT is often used by people with disabilities, people who are aging, or caregivers. AT can be as simple as a magnifier or as complex as voice-activated or eye gaze computer software.

What can WisTech do for you?

Device Demonstration

Learn about and try out a variety of AT devices.

Device Loan

Borrow devices and equipment to try out at home, work, or school.

Unlike device demonstrations, device loans allow individuals the experience of using the equipment for a trial period, before purchasing.

State Finance

Learn about the WisLoan and Telework programs that are available to finance AT, home modifications, vehicle modifications, or equipment that is needed to work.

Device Reutilization

Access recycled, repaired, and cleaned durable medical equipment and AT devices for individuals with disabilities and those who are aging and have mobility challenges.

Training and Technical Assistance

Learn about AT devices, services, funding, best practices, and web and document accessibility.

Information and Assistance

Connect with independent living center staff who are knowledgeable and trained on AT devices, their purpose, and functionality in a variety of settings, including home, school, work, and in the community.
